Saddam Hussein considered himself to be the reincarnation of

Nebuchadnezzar^[33] and had the inscription "To King Nebuchadnezzar in the reign of Saddam Hussein" inscribed on bricks inserted into the walls of the ancient city of Babylon during a reconstruction project he initiated;^[34] he named one of his Republican Guards divisions after Nebuchadnezzar.^[35]

Jeremiah 13:9 Thus saith the Lord, After this manner will I mar the pride of Judah, and the great pride of Jerusalem.

Jeremiah 48:29 We have heard the pride of Moab, (he is exceeding proud) his loftiness, and his arrogancy, and his pride, and the haughtiness of his heart.

Job 33:17 That he may withdraw man from his purpose, and hide pride from man. Job 35:12 There they cry, but none giveth answer, because of the pride of evil men. Job 41:15 His scales are his pride, shut up together as with a close seal. Job 41:34 He beholdeth all high things: he is a king over all the children of pride.

The antidote for pride is humility—meekness, submissiveness. (See <u>Alma 7:23</u>.) It is the broken heart and contrite spirit. (See <u>3 Ne. 9:20</u>; <u>3 Ne. 12:19</u>; <u>D&C 20:37</u>; <u>D&C 59:8</u>; <u>Ps. 34:18</u>; <u>Isa. 57:15</u>; <u>Isa. 66:2</u>.)
